



Service Animal Request for Accommodation

Redlands Community College works with employees and students to provide accommodations for needs related to cognitive, mental health, physical, and medical disabilities in compliance with Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, The American with Disabilities Act of 1990, the ADA Amendments Act of 2008 (ADAAA), and the Fair Housing Act Amended (FHAA).

ADAAA defines disability as a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more major life activities. Under this definition, an impairment is a disability if it substantially limits the ability of the person to perform a major life activity as compared to the average person in the general population, and generally lasting more than 6 months.

The individual making the request for a Service Animal (SA) should complete this form as soon as practicably possible before bringing the SA on campus property. This initiates the process of seeking approval for an SA. This application process could take up to 20 business days once all documentation has been turned in to the Disability Coordinator.

To help us ensure that your College assigned room/workspace is appropriately arranged and comfortable for both you and your service animal, could you please let us know what species the animal is? This information will only be used to assess space and layout needs, and not be used to evaluate the validity of your accommodation request.

Title I (Employment) does not define "service animal" the same way Titles II and III (Public Access) do. Under Titles II and III, only dogs (and in some cases miniature horses) qualify as service animals. In the workplace, however, there is no strict species limitation. This means that other animals may be considered reasonable accommodations if they are trained to perform tasks related to the employee's disability.
